"Spending Money" by Jimmy Buffet

• Lyrics like: "A little spending money, money to burn, Money that you did not necessarily earn...I got no financial conscience, Can't worry where it went..." depicts the feelings Americans had in the 1920s. They bought on credit and margin and didn't think about the consequences, which made their lives miserable when the stock market crashed.

"International Harvester" by Craig Morgan

• I chose this song to represent how farmers played a role in the cause of the Great Depression. They bought fancy equipment on loans and produced more goods than they could sell. A line from the song that relates is: "I make a lot of Hay for a little pay" and his pride in his work also reflects the excitement of new equipment.
